The maintenance staff will be undertaking the arduous task of aerification beginning the second week in September. Check the calendar for the exact schedule. This is needed more than ever this year with the toll that the heat and disease took on our fairways this summer.

Once again, our Junior Golf Day held on August 16<sup>th</sup> was a great success. There were about 150 juniors that participated and they, along with their parents all came away with great praise for the course and the volunteers. Those that lent their time to this great event should be very proud. A special thanks to Jay Packett and Joe Shaw who organize the day. It's a lot of work and they did a great job as always.

All members of the Captains should be aware of a reciprocal program among all of the municipal courses on the Cape. You can play Sandwich Hollows, Olde Barnstable Fairgrounds, Bass River, Bayberry Hills, Dennis Pines, Dennis Highlands, and Cranberry Valley on Monday through Thursday for a \$30 green fee. Make sure that you call ahead and ask about the reciprocal program as some of the requirements from course to course may vary. It's a great opportunity to see some of the other fine courses that Cape Cod has to offer.

We are hosting the New England Intercollegiate Golf Association Championship again this year on October 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup>. About 230 players representing 45 schools participate in this event that is played on both courses, both days. We will be soliciting for volunteers to help out during this tournament in the weeks to come. Both courses will be closed until 2:00 on both days.

# FROM THE GOLF COMMISSION

There are still a few more weeks of Summer, then the fun begins! September and October are my favorite months for golfing. The weather is cooler and everyone just seems to be in a better mood all of the time.

The Golf Commission has voted to offer "Pay Now, Play Now" again this year to entice non-resident members to join The Captains Golf Course. Here's the offer... Pay \$1,500 now and your membership starts on September 15, 2010 and continues through the fall, winter, spring, plus the entire 2011 season ending on March 31, 2012. There is even an installment plan! Pay \$750 now, then pay the balance of \$750 on April 1, 2011.

The Captains Golf Course once again produced net return to the Town of Brewster. For the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2010, the course returned approximately \$88,000 to the town.

The Golf Commission presented a list of potential course improvements and we have been approved to spend \$118,500. These improvements are planned to begin in late October following the NEIGA tournament. Here is the list:

- 1. Port #1 Tee Box. Repair the sinkhole and level the tee.
- 2. Port #10. Repair the sinkhole that is just short and left of the green.
- 3. Starboard #13 Tee Box. Repair the sinkhole and level the
- 4. Port #11 Tee Box. Level the tee.

While the summer has been very dry and our water usage is sky rocketing, it feels like the summer is almost over. With hurricane Earl on the way it could be a very interesting next couple of weeks. We did receive 6.04 inches of rain last week. Wish we could have had some of that during the last 10 weeks. Since then we have turned a little more green which is a good sign of recovery.

I came across an article on summer stress which is exactly what we were and still are going through. It tries to offer a clear and concise explanation of what happens to the turf under high heat conditions.

We have three left on staff at this point with no plans to hire anyone else until next spring. We did have a couple workers and I wish they could have stayed but school is more important.

Hopefully we will have a more moderate fall and get back to normal conditions. Have a great autumn season.

## **GOLF TIP**

The short game is where you score and putting is a big part of the short game. It is the one club you will use on every hole, unless you get lucky and chip one in the hole. Oddly enough it is the least practiced club.

There are five things you must do to make a good putting stroke.

- 1) You want your eyes directly over the ball. Drop a ball from between your eyes, it should hit the ball you're about to putt.
- 2) You want a shallow pendulum stroke with just the shoulders and arms swinging the clubhead straight back and thru. By having your eyes over the ball, the clubhead will strike the ball at the bottom of the pendulum causing the ball to roll, not bounce or skid from the start.
- 3) Make sure you aim the putter face to the target.
- 4) Always accelerate the clubhead thru the ball to the target.
- 5) And finally, you have to visualize the ball going into the hole and believe you will make every putt. If you think you're going to miss the putt or you're not sure of the putt, you will miss the putt!
